Dear Parent/Guardian,

We last sent out a news bulletin in May, but as we are at the end of Term 6, please bear in mind the following items of information.

**Term 1** begins on Monday 2nd September 2024 (Day 1) and is 34 days long. Term 1 ends on Thursday 17th October 2024.

<u>Attendance</u>: Please remember that 90% attendance over a year means 4 weeks of missed school. Congratulations to the following form groups which have the highest attendance so far:

Year 7 - Bridge, Gordon, Tower and Pitt: 98%

Year 8 - Bridge, Gordon, River, Thetford and Tower: 97%

Year 9 - Bridge, Castle, Gordon and Thetford: 97%

Year 10 - Castle, Thetford and Tower: 96%

Year 12 - Tower: 97%

**Reports:** Term 6 reports will be issued to Years 7, 10 and 12 this term which will advise on the end of year exam results.

School Uniform Providers: Our two uniform suppliers, Tacklebag and Monkhouse Schoolwear (previously Simmonds) will be supplying the full range of SJWMS Uniform and PE Kit over the summer break. Both providers supply the 5 mandatory branded items of uniform (tie, blazer badge, rugby jersey, rugby shorts and rugby socks) as well as other essential items, which can also be purchased from High Street retailers if preferred. Please note that prices charged by both suppliers are different, and Tacklebag, because it's an online only provider, charges less. <u>Sixth Form Induction</u>: Year 11 students attended our 4 day Sixth Form induction between the 9th and 12th July. We look forward to GCSE results day on 22nd August. Details of what students need to do to secure their place in our Sixth Form has been posted on Applicaa.

<u>A level and GCSE Results Days</u>: results will be available to collect in the sixth form study centre from 8am on 15th August for A Levels, and from 9am on 22nd August for GCSE's. Further information has been posted in the Year 11 and 13 Google Classrooms and on MCAS. We wish our students all the very best.

<u>Year 12 Work Experience</u>: this occurred between 8th - 12th July and we are very pleased with how our students tackled being in a workplace. The feedback from employers has been enormously positive.

<u>Online safety</u>: we continue to be mindful of the risks to our students associated with the increased time spent online. We make regular posts in Google Classrooms to help raise awareness and encourage sensible online behaviour, and strongly encourage parents to exercise heightened curiosity about what their son or daughter is doing online.

Keeping our students safe online is an absolute priority for the school.

Our various 'Acceptable Use' policies aim to set out what students should do to stay safe online.

The most important document is the **Student Acceptable Use Policy**.

These provide common sense pointers on how to operate in the online environment.

In the unlikely event of having to implement remote learning, we have <u>a document</u> which addresses the dos and don'ts for safe online learning. A similar one exists for staff.

<u>School Mock General Election</u>: In order to promote political debate and help our students engage with the key political debates of the moment, our Politics Department under the leadership of Dr Bidmead hosted a Mock General Election, culminating with a vote on polling day.

We have been delighted with how our students have responded to the hustings, poster campaigns and assemblies from senior students representing the main political parties. We commend them all on the quality of their debate and discourse, and respect for differing viewpoints.

The voter turnout for our Mock Election was nearly 70%, and the winning party was Labour with 31% of the vote.

**Prize Giving**: Our Senior Prize giving took place on Tuesday 16th July and we were delighted to issue over 100 prizes to some worthy winners in years 10 and 12. The guest of honour was Mr Rajan Lal, an ex-student, past Senior prefect, graduate and current fellow of Cambridge University.
