Dear Parent/Guardian,

We last sent out a news bulletin in November, but as we near the end of Term 2, please bear in mind the following items of information:

Term 3 is 28 days long, begins on 3rd January 2024 (Day 3) and ends on Friday 9th February.

<u>Attendance</u>: Please remember that 90% attendance over a year means 4 weeks of missed school. Congratulations to the following form groups which have the highest attendance so far:

Year 7 - Pitt: 99% Year 8 - Thetford: 98%

Year 9 - Castle, Gordon and Thetford: 97%

Year 10 - River and Tower: 96% Year 11 - Gordon and Tower: 97%

Year 12 - Bridge, River, Thetford and Tower: 97%

Year 13 - Thetford and Tower: 95%

Reports: Term 2 reports will be issued to Years 11 and 13 only at the end of this term, and Year 12 will receive their class test results.

Mock Exams: these commence for Year 13 on 3rd January. The exam timetable has been posted on the year group classroom.

Year 9 Parents' Evening: is on Thursday 4th January, using the School Cloud software.

<u>Year 9 GCSE option choices</u>: GCSE Options Evening is scheduled for 25th January at 7pm, and the deadline for choices is Friday 2nd February. Choices will be made via a Google Form. Year 9 had an introduction assembly on 29 November, and Triple/Combined science recommendation letters will be sent home at the start of next term. <u>Sixth Form Applications:</u> our Sixth Form Open Evening is on Monday 8th January starting at 6.30pm. Year 11 students should attend. The closing date for applications (which will be made via software called 'Applicaa') is Monday 22nd January.

<u>Prefects:</u> new Year 12 Prefects were appointed this term, and served their first duty at the Carol Service. We are hugely reliant on these high-calibre individuals, who go through a robust selection process, involving a voting procedure and interviews. Congratulations to our chosen Prefects. The new School Captain and Deputies are selected at Easter.

Non-Uniform Day: this took place on 22nd November and raised £2,526.00. This money will be used to help support school projects. The next one is on 28th February.

<u>Online safety:</u> we continue to be mindful of the risks to our students associated with the increased time spent online. We make regular posts in Google Classrooms to help raise awareness and encourage sensible online behaviour, and strongly encourage parents to exercise heightened curiosity about what their son or daughter is doing online.

<u>Detentions</u>: Good order and discipline are essential to the provision of a high standard of education. Effective teaching and learning can only take place in a well ordered environment.

Our school manages behaviour extremely well so we can provide a calm, safe and supportive environment which our pupils want to attend and where they can learn and thrive. Detentions are a key part of this.

<u>Safeguarding</u>: permeates every aspect of our school and influences all decisions and actions taken by our staff. Our <u>Child Protection Policy</u> describes this aspect of our work, and the <u>Safeguarding pages</u> of our website are very useful. Our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) is Mr Morris, and he is supported by 2 Deputy DSL's, 7 Heads of Year and 3 Heads of School/Key Stage. Each Key Stage has 2 or 3 non-teaching pastoral support staff. We have 5 Mental Health First Aiders, 6 Learning Support Assistants, 3 ELSA practitioners and 2 Counsellors.
